THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Roman Road of Salvation

"Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God—which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the Holy Scriptures—concerning his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who was a descendant of David according to the flesh and was appointed to be the powerful Son of God according to the Spirit of holiness by the resurrection of the dead. ...

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, first to the Jew, and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, just as it is written: The righteous will live by faith" (Romans 1:1-4, 16-17 CSB).

The gospel is not good advice about how to live. It is good news about a person. As both John the Baptist and Jesus preached: the kingdom of heaven is at hand; repent and believe the gospel. Jesus has come for us and for our salvation. Our congregation has patiently worked through the first eight chapters of Romans during our Sunday morning worship service. In those chapters Paul explains many of the aspects or components of the good news of what Jesus has done for us. We have learned about sin and rebellion, faith and repentance, justification and sanctification, and union with Christ (being *in Christ*) and the incredible work of the Holy Spirit.

This reminds me of another of the Apostle's epistles, 1st Corinthians. Read 1:18-31 slowly:

"For the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but it is the power of God to us who are being saved. For it is written,

> I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and I will set aside the intelligence of the intelligent.

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the debater of this age? Hasn't God made the world's wisdom foolish? For since, in God's wisdom, the world did not know God through wisdom, God was pleased to save those who believe through the foolishness of what is preached. For the Jews ask for

signs and the Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to the Gentiles. Yet to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God, because God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Brothers and sisters, consider your calling: Not many were wise from a human perspective, not many powerful, not many of noble birth. Instead, God has chosen what is foolish in the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen what is weak in the world to shame the strong. God has chosen what is insignificant and despised in the world—what is viewed as nothing—to bring to nothing what is viewed as something, so that no one may boast in his presence. It is from him that you are in Christ Jesus, who became wisdom from God for us—our righteousness, sanctification, and redemption—in order that, as it is written: Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

The world does not care much for Jesus—well, that is, the real Jesus of the Scripture. In facts it despises him. However, Jesus is the focus of our preaching. Jesus is the object of our faith. Jesus is the hope of our lives—from today into eternity. Do you know him? Do you love him? Have you responded to the call of his Father? Does the Holy Spirit dwell within you? If yes, then you have everything! If no... We will shortly get to Romans 10. In anticipation I close with this offer of the gospel:

"This is the message of faith that we proclaim: If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. For the Scripture says, **Everyone who believes on him will not be put to shame,** since there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord of all richly blesses all who call on him. For **everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"** (Romans 10:8b-13).

We hope you will sign up for a time slot and join our congregation in a time faithful prayer.




DAY OF PENTECOST
