THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Our God is in heaven and does whatever he pleases. Psalm 115:3

Dr. Knox Chamblin introduced this verse to our faculty-led prayer group one Wednesday morning at RTS-Jackson. His devotional on this verse concerned the personal and family challenges he was facing. He assumed that seminary students would benefit from his witness and counsel. He was surely correct. This verse has been a mainstay for me for 25 years now.

Our God

Believers—regenerate members of the body of Christ—can collectively use the personal plural pronoun to refer to *our* God. Has that wondrous fact ceased to amaze you of late? God is the creator of the heavens and the earth, of the sea and all that is in them. He is *our* God. He is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. He is *our* God. Yet he will not fail to judge the wicked and rebellious according to their sin. He is *our* God. He sent his Son to live for us and to die for our sins. Jesus rose again and sent his Holy Spirit to dwell within every believer. He is *our* God. Do not lose your sense of wonder at your close and personal relationship with God through Christ.

Our God is in heaven

Since God is in heaven, Derek Thomas tells us, "The one who most desires to help us is *able* to do so. Because he resides in heaven he is in a position to do for us what we cannot do. 'His almighty arm,' writes Witsius, 'which is ever ready to be stretched forth in behalf of his own people, no created power is able to resist.'" Is that good news of what? By being in heaven, John Calvin writes, God "is lifted up above all chance of either corruption or change...it is as if he had been said to be of infinite greatness or loftiness, of incomprehensible essence, of boundless might, and of everlasting immortality." We are needy creatures made in God's image. He is capable to meet our needs according to his wisdom and good pleasure.

and does whatever he pleases.

As we meditate on this profound truth, remember that "God is a spirit, Whose being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness and truth are infinite, eternal, and unchangeable" (WSC Q. 4). We want him to always do whatever he pleases. Do we want this with fallen humans? Not so much! But with God... A God "who is not the prisoner of circumstances but their master, is a God to glory in" (D. Kidner). Indeed. We often feel trapped as in quicksand or even concrete. Not so with God. He is determined to accomplish his will. And that includes finishing the good work he began in each of us (see. Phil. 1).

Our God is in heaven and does whatever he pleases. This is great news for us today and every day. It has been for the church in all ages. Friends, we look around both nearby, in our country, and around the world and we see wickedness, abuse of power, immorality, and injustice. God sees it too. And God remains in control. Jesus remains the King of kings. And his Spirit remains the Spirit of truth. So you remain steadfast under whatever trial you may be facing. And pray for your spiritual leaders to do the same. I will close with further verses from Psalm 115. You who fear the LORD, trust in the LORD! He is their help and shield. The LORD remembers us and will bless us. ... he will bless those who fear the LORD—small and great alike (11-12a, 13).


